Camp BeeTree is a one-week vacation Bible camp experience. Children who have completed Kindergarten through fifth grade are invited to join us for this exciting and fun learning experience. Children must be able to follow directions, understand the importance of staying with their group, be toilet trained, and be able to tolerate a physically demanding full-day outdoor camp experience.



□ Counselor -in-Training / CITs" (currently enrolled in 6-12) - \$100 per child

Middle and high schoolers are valued participants in the Camp BeeTree experience as a counselor-in-training. Assisting adult leaders as CITs, they teach, guide and support many aspects of the total program. Each day, CITs have a special mid-day program planned for them to meet for fellowship and fun. The Saturday before camp, CITs go to BeeTree for a Teen Work Camp to prep the camp and participate in team building and fellowship activities. The Saturday after camp, CITs are part of the breakdown team.



CITs must be good role models for our young campers, so we first require them to complete an application. If they are accepted, then they will be notified and can continue with the registration process. Community service credit hours are available.

Camp BeeTree is run entirely by volunteers. Parents are encouraged to volunteer, either on site or in preparation for the camp week. Help is needed to purchase supplies, prepare food and materials, supervise activities and lead age groups. CHILD SAFETY

Your child's safety is top priority to all of us. Help us by reminding your child about the importance of following instructions given by adult leaders, staying with their assigned group, and staying in their seats and using a quiet voice on the bus to make the bus ride safer and more comfortable for everyone.

Trained volunteers will be on site to provide first aid / CPR if needed. Adults in all areas will carry cell phones and will have first aid kits nearby.

In case of thunderstorm, we will shelter in place or return to Towson Presbyterian Church. If it is raining without lighting & thunder, we will carry on with our program at BeeTree unless it becomes unsafe to do so.

ABOUT BEE TREE PRESERVE

Our camp is held at the beautiful BeeTree Preserve, a 258-acre tract of land located in upper Baltimore County, approximately 25 minutes from Towson Presbyterian Church. It features wooded areas with hiking trails, a stream, two covered pavilions, a large open area for games, and separate bathroom facilities for boys and girls. It is a unique and ideal spot for our annual vacation Bible camp, Camp BeeTree.

Directions: From 695, take I-83 North towards Harrisburg for 17.8 miles. Take Exit 33 "Parkton MD 45". At the top of the exit ramp, turn left and proceed 1.3 miles. Turn left on Kaufman Road and proceed 1.3 miles to BeeTree. At the Five-Forks stop sign, continue straight. Signs designate a road on the left entering BeeTree Cemetery and farther along, another leading to the Davis Pavilion. Parking is available at the lower pavilion.

GETTING READY FOR CAMP

Each day, campers will need a backpack containing (please write campers name on all belongings):

□ bagged lunch (with ice pack if needed)

□ a towel

□ a plastic bag to store a wet bathing suit

set of dry clothes (in case of an emergency)

□ refillable water bottle

water shoes (no flip flops or open-toed shoes)

□ hat (optional)

Each day, campers should wear:

swimsuit under clothes (or swim trunks that dry quickly)

sunscreen

□ bug spray

□ sneakers (no flip flops or open toe shoes)

□ long socks (to reduce bug bites)
