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The passage from the Gospel of Mark helps us to remember our love for the creator god. Everyday we praise god with our lives.

We are being asked by Jesus to rearrange our lives by centering on the one who is the great giver of love and life. Jesus is being asked by a scribe in a crowd **"Which commandment is the first of all?"** This question gets to the heart of what one believes. **29jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; 30you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' 31The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' there is no other commandment greater than these."**

The scribe confirmed the importance of how one lives and loves in life. **32Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; 33and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,'—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices."**
